1. Would you support or oppose requiring able-bodied adults to work, train, or volunteer at least 20 hours per week as a condition of eligibility for Medicaid?

62% OF LIKELY VOTERS STRONGLY OR SOMEWHAT SUPPORT

Strongly or Somewhat Support	62%	72%	50%	60%
Strongly or Somewhat Oppose	31%	22%	43%	31%
Unsure	7%	7%	7%	9%

2. Would you support or oppose requiring the state to verify whether Medicaid applicants are truly eligible for the program before they are allowed to enroll?

3. Would you support or oppose cross-checking employment and wage data against Medicaid rolls at least monthly to ensure that recipients are truly qualified for the program?

4. Would you support or oppose requiring the state to review Medicaid rolls at least twice per year to ensure that recipients are still eligible for the program?

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5. Would you support or oppose requiring Medicaid recipients to update their employment and income information with the state once per year?

6. Would you support or oppose suspending hospitals from making decisions about a patient's Medicaid eligibility if they knowingly extend Medicaid benefits to ineligible patients three or more times?

7. Which of the following statements comes closest to your view, even if neither is exactly right?

67% OF LIKELY VOTERS SAY "LIMIT MEDICAID ELIGIBILITY"

Indiana should limit Medicaid eligibility to the truly needy to preserve resources for other government services, such as education and public safety.	67%	73%	58%	66%
Indiana should expand Medicaid eligibility to non-working, able-bodied adults, even if it means cutting resources from education and public safety.	33%	27%	42%	34%

Results for this poll were collected using a sampling frame from an online panel collected by the Center for Excellence in Polling. The statewide sample is of 541 likely Indiana voters.

The survey was conducted December 18-24, 2024. The margin of sampling error is ± 4.21 percentage points. The margin of sampling error may be higher for subgroups. Results presented may not always appear to total 100 percent due to rounding.

Data were post-stratified using weighted demographic information from the U.S. Census Bureau's Current Population Survey Voting and Registration Supplement and the state election authorities. Demographic information for actual voters in past elections was used to construct sample target weights.
